

Draft Resolution No. 1 of the General Meeting of the Coalition Clean Baltic, dated 5 June 2020, redefining of the Working Areas framework

§ 1

Acting on the basis of the Article 28 point 15 of *the Constitution of the Coalition Clean Baltic*, the General Meeting of the Coalition Clean Baltic hereby decides on setting the following Working Areas:

Proposal no. 1

1. Biodiversity and Nature Conservation
2. Fisheries and Aquaculture
3. Water Protection in Agriculture
4. River Basin Management (covering wastewaters, River Watch, inland harmful installations and operations)
5. Sustainable Development in Coastal and Marine Areas (covering costal and offshore harmful installations, maritime transport, hazardous substances and marine litter, Coast Watch)

OR

Proposal no. 2

1. Biodiversity
2. Eutrophication
3. Hazardous substances
4. Maritime activities

OR

Proposal no. 3

1. Water Protection in Agriculture
2. River Basin and Wastewater Management
3. Fisheries and Aquaculture
4. Hazardous Substances and Marine Litter
5. Biodiversity and Nature Conservation
6. Sustainable Development in Coastal and Marine Areas
7. Harmful Installations and Maritime Transport

OR

Other proposals from the Network

§ 2

Priority Areas are abolished.

§ 3

Additionally, cross-sectoral activities, based on inter-area cooperation, should be set up by, e.g. focused on the HELCOM Baltic Sea Action Plan, EU Marine Strategy Framework Directive, EU Water Framework Directive, green consumerism, EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region, climate change, etc.

§ 4

Until the next Ordinary General Meeting, the existing Biennial Plan of Action shall be followed.

§ 5

Implementation of the present Resolution will apply to the next biennial *Plan of Action* of the Association for the period January 1, 2022 – December 31, 2023 and to each subsequent biennial *Plan of Action*.

§ 6

The Resolution shall enter into force on the date of its adoption, repealing the *Resolution No. 1 of the Extraordinary General Meeting of the Coalition Clean Baltic, held in Tallinn, dated May 19, 2013 regarding the redefinition of the Priority Areas framework*.
